- Curriculum - elective options

- Broaden your career choices through a wide variety of elective courses
- Explore specialty practice areas
 - Ex. geriatric, underserved communities, diabetes prevention and care, and more
- Complete a certificate → do not need to take additional years in 4-year program
 - Plein certificate in Geriatrics
 - Biomedical regulatory affairs certificate
 - Clinical trials certificate
- Extend your studies
 - Pharmaceutical outcomes research and policy (MS)
 - Pharmaceutics (PhD)
 - PharmD/PA program (5-year program)
 - PharmD/MBA program (5-year program)

- Curriculum - interprofessional education

- Prepare for an evolving professional and environment
- Located in the center of the UW health sciences

- Take classes with students who are aspiring physicians, etc.
- Professional development opportunities
 - Extracurricular activities compliment your training
 - Professional networking day
 - Pharmacy friday events
 - Community immunization programs
 - Student leadership opportunities, clubs, and organizations
- PharmD program outcomes
 - Prepares graduates for licensure exams needed to practice pharmacy
 - NAPLEX 100% pass rate from the class of 2019
 - UW pass rate is higher than national pass rate for both first-time NAPLEX passing rate and first-time MPJE passing rate from 2016-2020
- Practicing pharmacy in Washington
 - UW-led initiative
 - Pharmacist-provided immunization services
 - Emergency contraception
 - Tobacco cessation
 - Pharmacists have provider status as part of the health care team, increasing patient access to care and allows for payments of services
- PharmD application process and requirements
 - Submit PharmCAS application
 - TBD: priority consideration deadline
 - Dec. 1 final application deadline
 - Includes:
 - Application (demographic info, coursework uploaded)
 - Official transcripts (sent directly to PharmCAS)
 - 2 letters of rec required
 - From a source who can speak to your professional demeanor
 - Complete prerequisites
 -
 - BA or BS recommended, not required
 - Submit transcripts and letters of recs to PharmCAS
 - Interviews for all qualified applicants
 - Virtual for 2021-2022 academic year
 - Rolling admissions

- Tuition and financial aid
 - 2021-2022 academic year
 - Resident: \$34,335 per year
 - Non-resident: \$56,580 per year
 - Additional health science (\$200) and lab fees (\$20-125/lab)
 - Submit FAFSA
 - Merit and need-based alumni and donor scholarships are available
- Finding funding for school
 - Most scholarship deadlines occur btw Nov.-Mar.
 - UW SOP
 - Scholarship application opens in spring
 - SOP scholarships typically range from \$1,000 to \$3,000
 - UW graduate funding info service (GFIS)
 - American association of colleges of pharmacy (AACP)
